

Note to the Coalitions:

PROGRAMS IN THE FY 2011-2012 BUDGET WITH A MAJOR ROLE IN THE NORTHEAST-MIDWEST REGION



At present, Congress is engaged in making difficult decisions on how best to promote economic growth and stability while reducing the nation's deficit. Specifically, it is considering several pieces of legislation with funding allocations for federal programs for the rest of Fiscal Year 2011 and the recently released Administration Budget for Fiscal Year 2012. With this *Note to the Coalitions*, the Northeast-Midwest Institute describes selected federal programs with a major role in the Northeast-Midwest region, and provides information on spending amounts for these programs in each of the NEMW states. Data are derived from the Combined Federal Funds Report (CFFR), produced by the U.S. Census Bureau over several years.¹

This *Note to the Coalitions* contains data from FY2005-FY2009, including: 1) amount allocated to each state/entity; 2) percentage of total U.S. funds; and 3) rank among all states/entities that received funding in a fiscal year. Programs listed in this *Note to the Coalitions* include, in alphabetical order: Appalachian Regional Commission Projects, Brownfields Programs under the Environmental Protection Agency, Community Development Block Grants (Entitlement Grants and State's Program), Clean Water State Revolving Fund, Demolition and Revitalization of Severely Distressed Public Housing, Drinking Water State Revolving Fund, Federal Transit-Capital Investment Grants, Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, Manufacturing Extension Partnership (MEP) Program, the Technology Innovation Program (TIP), and Trade Adjustment Assistance for Firms.²

Appalachian Regional Commission

23.002 Appalachia Area Development, Appalachian Regional Commission

This program aims to help the Appalachian region by nurturing self-sustaining economic development, while providing special assistance to the region's most distressed areas. The program supports the Appalachian Regional Commission's (ARC) mission as a strategic partner and advocate for sustainable community and economic development. Program goals are: (1) Increase job opportunities and per capita income in Appalachia to reach parity with the nation; (2) Strengthen the capacity of the people of Appalachia to compete in the global economy; (3) Develop and improve the region's infrastructure to make the region economically competitive; and (4) Build the Appalachian Development Highway System to reduce Appalachia's isolation.

Brownfields Redevelopment and Superfund Clean-up Programs

66.814 Brownfields Training, Research, and Technical Assistance Grants and Cooperative Agreements, Environmental Protection Agency, Office of Solid Waste and Emergency Response

Brownfields are real property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant. The Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) further defines the term

"brownfield site" to include a site that "is contaminated by a controlled substance...; is contaminated by petroleum or a petroleum product excluded from the definition of 'hazardous substance'...; or is mine-scarred land." CERCLA, section 104(k)(6) provides EPA with authority to train, research, and technically assist individuals and organizations with brownfields inventory, assessment, cleanup, community involvement, or site preparation.

66.817 State and Tribal Response Program Grants, Environmental Protection Agency, Office of Solid Waste and Emergency Response

The Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), Section 128(a) program funds help establish or enhance state and tribal response program capacity, capitalize revolving loan funds (RLFs), and support insurance mechanisms. The funding provides financial support for elements of an effective state or tribal response program and to ensure that states and tribes maintain a public record of sites in their programs.

This program aims to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate income. Recipient communities may undertake a wide range of community-based activities directed toward neighborhood revitalization, economic development, and community services, facilities, and improvements. Each CDBG eligible activity must meet one of three national objectives: benefit low- and moderate-income persons, aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight, or meet other community development needs having a particular urgency that the grantee is unable to finance on its own. Eligible grantees include: principal cities of Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs); other metropolitan cities with populations of at least 50,000; and qualified urban counties with populations of at least 200,000 (excluding the population of entitled cities).

Eligible grantees include: cities with populations of less than 50,000 (except cities that are designated principal cities of Metropolitan Statistical Areas), and counties with populations of less than 200,000.

This program creates State Revolving Funds (SRFs) through capitalization grants to States to provide a long term source of State financing for construction of wastewater treatment facilities and implementation of other water quality management activities. The capitalization grant is deposited in the State's SRF, which is used to provide loans and other types of financial assistance, to local communities and inter-municipal and interstate agencies. States determine priorities for funding within their State in accordance with the Clean Water Act. Capitalization grants to each State were also made available under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Recovery Act) of 2009. Under the Recovery Act and in FY2010, a portion of funding was targeted toward green infrastructure, water and energy efficiency, and environmentally innovative projects.

Drinking Water State Revolving Fund

66.468 Capitalization Grants for Drinking Water State Revolving Fund, Environmental Protection Agency, Office of Water

Through this program, grants are made to States and Puerto Rico to capitalize their Drinking Water State Revolving Funds (DWSRFs) which will provide a long-term source of financing for the costs of drinking water infrastructure. Grants are also made to the District of Columbia, U.S. Territories, and Indian Tribes. In FY 2010, the funding priority established by the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) was infrastructure improvement projects that are needed to achieve or maintain compliance with SDWA requirements, protect public health, and assist systems with economic need. A State may use a portion of the capitalization grant funds for programs that emphasize preventing contamination problems through source water protection and enhancing water system management. Capitalization grants were also made available under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Recovery Act) of 2009. A portion of this funding was targeted toward projects for green infrastructure, water or energy efficiency improvements, or other environmentally innovative activities.

This program helps economically distressed U.S. business in building competitiveness strategies to increase exports and thereby create jobs. The program provides technical assistance to U.S. businesses that have lost sales and employment due to increased imports of similar or competitive goods and services. Technical assistance is provided through a nationwide network of eleven Economic Development Administration (EDA) funded Trade Adjustment Assistance Centers (TAACs) in the development of a petition for certification of eligibility under the program, and in the development and implementation of business recovery plans and matching funds for projects.
