Great Lakes Provisions in the President's Fiscal Year 2025 Budget

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Despite the fiscal year 2024 appropriations process being only half-concluded, work on FY 2025 has officially begun with the release of President Biden's budget. Many provisions impacting the Great Lakes were included. The \$3.7 trillion proposal is a mixed bag. It includes an 8.4% increase over FY 2023 levels and a 20% increase over the FY 2024 appropriation passed earlier this month for the Environmental Protection Agency, but would cut funding for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund by 24.4%. It would increase funding for NOAA's climate change programs, but would sharply cut that agency's budget in other areas, particularly ocean, coastal, and Great Lakes research.

The Northeast-Midwest Institute (NEMWI) has provided this summary highlighting some of the key appropriations bills and accounts pertaining to the Great Lakes.

Additional Items of Interest

Harmful Algal Blooms (HABs)

In the FY 2024 Commerce, Justice, and Science appropriations bill, \$14 million from NOAA's Competitive Research account was directed to research on HABs. The

President's budget does not give a number for HABs research specifically, but it does decrease funding for the Competitive Research account to \$5 million from \$20 million in FY 2024.

Center of Excellence for Operational Ocean and Great Lakes Mapping

The President's budget would terminate the Center of Excellence for Operational Ocean and Great Lakes Mapping, which had been funded at \$10 million in FY 2023, but did not receive funding in FY 2024.

The budget requests \$200,000, equal to the FY 2024 level, for interbasin control of Great Lakes-Mississippi River aquatic nuisance species.

Regional Sediment Management.

The budget requests \$2.9 million, up from the FY 2024 level of \$2.6 million, for the Corps' Regional Sediment Management Program.

Lake Champlain

The budget includes \$25 million to the Lake Champlain Program, to be used in part on projects that will reduce phosphorus loading to make progress towards meeting the 2016 TMDL. The program was appropriated an additional \$8 million in the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law for FY 2025. If the President's budget were to be enacted, the program would be funded at \$33 million.

WIFIA

The President's budget would fund the Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act at \$80 million, up from \$72.27 million in FY 2024.

U.S. Geological Survey (USGS)

The budget includes \$32 million for USGS's Environmental Health Program, an increase from \$29.5 million in FY 2024. This includes funding for research on PFAS and HABs, among other things.

National Water Quality Program

The budget includes \$106.2 million for the National Water Quality program, an increase from \$96 million in FY 2024.
